## Year 2 Term 2 Curriculum Overview

Religious Education	Students pose questions about the life and times of Jesus and use sources provided to answer these questions. They will make connections between Jesus' teachings and actions and the way members of the Church community live today. Students will participate in a variety of personal and communal prayer experiences, including meditative prayer and prayers for forgiveness.
English	Students will understand how similar texts share similar characteristics by identifying text structures. They will monitor meaning when reading, using punctuation. Students will identify implied meaning and main ideas when engaging with texts. They will make connections between texts by comparing content. Student will create texts drawing on their imagination. They will learn to accurately spell words with regular spelling patterns and use punctuation accurately.
Mathematics	Students will continue to develop their fluency with increasing and decreasing number sequences involving 2s, 3s and 5s. They will explain the effects of one-step transformations. Students will perform simple addition and subtraction calculations using a range of strategies. They will order shapes and objects using informal units. Students will draw two-dimensional shapes. They will describe outcomes for everyday events.
Science	Students will describe changes to objects. They will pose and respond to questions about their experiences and predict outcomes. Students will compare observations and communicate ideas in a variety of ways.
Humanities and Social Sciences	Students will identify how and why the lives of people have changed over time while others have remained the same.
Technologies	Students will explain how technologies use forces to create movement in products.
